Since its founding in 2018, the Columbia Global Center in Tunis has been committed to impact locally and regionally. We are proud to highlight some of our accomplishments across our main thematic areas of work.

- Education: The Tunis Center partnered with the US Department of State, the Tunisian Ministry of Higher Education, the Algerian Ministry of Higher Education and Scientific Research, and Teachers College at Columbia University to develop the TC-Foreign Language Teacher Education Project in Tunisia and Algeria. A two-year transformative initiative, the project provided professional development in English language teaching to participants from higher education institutions in both countries.
- Business & Entrepreneurship: We are a founding partner of Open Startup Tunisia, a project that supports entrepreneurship in Tunisia and the region.
- **Health & Medicine**: We host the Logical Reasoning in Human Genetics initiative in partnership with Institut Pasteur de Tunis. To date, this ongoing initiative has provided more than 1,500 participants with access to online lectures led by renowned professionals in the field of human genetics.
- Humanities, Arts & Social Sciences: The Tunis Center has become a hub for the study of humanities, arts, and social sciences in Tunisia. Over the years, we have welcomed around 150 faculty and students from diverse fields, promoting dialogue and initiating debates in the br faculty and students from diverse fields, promoting dialogue and initiating debates in the broader field.oader field.

Program highlights

- Pluralisms in Emergenc(i)es: In collaboration with the Institute for Religion, Culture, and Public Life at Columbia University and Columbia Global Center Amman, we initiated the "Pluralisms in Emergenc(i)es" conference series, examining the emergence of pluralism in response to contemporary global crises in the Middle East and North Africa. The discussions and research presented during these conferences were consolidated into a dedicated issue of the Review of Middle East Studies journal.
- President's Global Innovation Fund (PGIF): Columbia Global Center Tunis hosted four research projects on various critical issues in the region, including migration, education, business, and social science.
- Columbia University Press: We are credited with introducing Columbia University Press books in Tunisia, and we helped import hundreds of titles at a discounted price. This initiative has fostered connections with local publishers and booksellers and expanded the number of books available to the Tunisian academic and intellectual community.
