Advancing Recovery Through Innovation: The Global Resilience Fund

What happens when one of the world's leading academic institutions joins forces with local changemakers in a region facing unprecedented challenges? At the **Columbia Global Center** in Istanbul, the answer unfolds daily through groundbreaking research, disaster risk reduction and resilience, and cross-cultural dialogue that shapes our global future.

When the February 2023 earthquakes struck Türkiye, our response went beyond immediate aid to pioneer innovative solutions for long-term recovery. The Global Resilience Fund, launched by Columbia Global, became a cornerstone of our impact, supporting groundbreaking projects that merge academic expertise with practical needs:

Healing Minds, Understanding Trauma Under the leadership of Professor Çağhan Kızıl from the Department of Neurology and the Taub Institute, and Professor Richard Mayeux, Chair of the Department of Neurology at Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons, our focused group therapy program is revolutionizing trauma recovery. By combining therapeutic support with advanced EEG-based brain imaging, we're not only helping 500 survivors process their experiences but also advancing our understanding of emotional regulation in crisis situations. This research will inform trauma response strategies worldwide.

Reimagining Urban Resilience In Hatay, our team led by Professors Jacqueline Klopp from the Center for Sustainable Urban Development, Ebru Gencer from the Graduate School of Architecture, Planning and Preservation, and Andrew Kruckiewicz from the International Research Institute for Climate and Society, is pioneering a multi-risk urban planning approach that could transform how cities rebuild after disasters. By integrating seismic and climate risk assessments with social vulnerability factors, we're creating a model for sustainable urban development that prioritizes both physical infrastructure and community needs.

Ensuring Health Equity in Crisis The HEARTS Study, directed by Professor Juliana Bol from Columbia University Irving Medical Center, represents a crucial step forward in understanding how disasters affect vulnerable populations. By examining health challenges faced by refugees in post-earthquake Türkiye, we're developing frameworks to ensure crisis response strategies address the needs of all community members.

Climate Action and Urban Sustainability

Our work on climate resilience highlights the impact of cross-disciplinary collaboration. Through the Urban Futurity: Navigating Climate and Seismic Resilience initiative, we united experts from disaster mitigation, urban planning, and climate science to explore integrated strategies for enhancing urban resilience. By addressing critical issues such as sustainable water management, spatial planning, and community-driven solutions, the event underscored the importance of innovative, collaborative approaches to building cities capable of withstanding climate change and seismic risks.

The Climate and Economy Conference, organized in partnership with the World Wildlife Fund and the European Climate Foundation, transformed how journalists and policymakers understand the intersection of climate change and economic systems. We equipped journalists with the tools to effectively communicate complex climate economics to diverse audiences.

Our Climate Change and Security roundtable focused on the critical link between climate change and global security, creating an interdisciplinary dialogue among scholars, experts, and policymakers. The event concentrated on the ways climate change influences regional security dynamics and global stability. To further engage the public, we have published a comprehensive briefing note, available on our website, which offers deeper insights into the discussions and findings from the event.

Fostering Dialogue Across Boundaries

Voices of Emerging Scholars Led by Prof. Zeynep Çelik and Merve İspahani, PhD, the series continued with a two-day long roundtable at the Istanbul Center with a vibrant group of early-career scholars from Türkiye and the US.

Diplomacy in Action The Foreign Policy and Diplomacy Lecture Series, led by distinguished scholar Soli Özel and the Istanbul Center's Academic Programs Manager Merve İspahani, brought together diplomats and policy experts to explore Türkiye's evolving role in global affairs.

Arts as Catalyst for Change The second edition of our ReelLife Film Series—created in dynamic partnership with the UNDP Istanbul Regional Hub and Pera Museum—addressed pressing social issues. Post-screening discussions provided a platform for audiences and filmmakers to delve into the complex challenges facing our region.

Preserving Independent Voices

In an era where independent journalism faces unprecedented challenges, our commitment to supporting press freedom took center stage this year. Through two key initiatives, we created vital lifelines for journalists navigating complex professional landscapes.

Our Journalism in Exile workshop was more than just a training program—it established a safe space where displaced journalists could rebuild their networks and envision new futures for their craft.

The Masterclass in Journalism: The Art of Pitching, organized with the International Press Institute and led by Columbia Journalism School alumna Elif Ince, equipped participants with skills for engaging with and placing their stories with international media outlets. Following the program, participant Melisa Ishbitiren, published an article in The Guardian, demonstrating how regional voices can achieve global reach with the right support.

Strengthening Our Columbia Community

Building the Republic Conference Our two-day conference on the centennial of the Republic of Türkiye, organized with the Sakıp Sabancı Center for Turkish Studies, brought together distinguished scholars from four countries to examine the political, cultural, and social developments from the 1920s to the 1940s. The event attracted over 200 attendees, with more than 20 distinguished speakers, fostering vital discussions about Türkiye's history and future.



Alumni Engagement & Leadership

Our commitment to nurturing the Columbia community in Türkiye flourished through three channels:

Executive Vice President of Columbia Global Wafaa El-Sadr's November 2023 visit to Istanbul catalyzed meaningful exchange, featuring insights from retired Ambassador Ayşe Sinirlioğlu and updates on Columbia Global's vision for the region.

Professional Networks Through the Columbia School of International and Public Affairs (SIPA) Türkiye Alumni speaker series, we fostered ongoing dialogue among graduates while strengthening professional connections across sectors.


